Checklist for New Students

1. Accept your admission and apply for student aid

Confirm your place on antagning.se, and apply for student aid (CSN) at CSN.se.

2. Register in Ladok

As a new student, you need to register via student.ladok.se. You must register before every course, so don't forget to do it on time!

3. Get an SEDU account

As a new student you'll need to register for a SEDU account, information can be found under paragraph 4 on the SEDU website. With your SEDU account you gain access to the learning platform Canvas, your student email, and Office 365.

4. Find your schedule and syllabus

The SEDU uses the scheduling system TimeEdit. Finding the correct schedule can be a bit tricky, so use the course code you'll find in Ladok.

For example, if you're studying the first semester of the Bachelor's Programme, the course code for International Relations is 1SS079.

Once you've found your schedule, the next step is course literature! Reading lists are usually found at the bottom of the course syllabus or in a separate literature list. You can find syllabi on the student portal at fhs.se.

Pro tip: Look for course literature at the Student Union's book marketplace. Search for "FHS Boktorget" on Facebook.

5. Get your access card

As a new student, you must obtain an access card. The Swedish Defence University uses personal access cards, and to create yours you must be photographed. Times for card registration will be announced on the student portal and communicated separately.

Please note: SEDU is a protected site. Visitors are welcome in the open areas (the entrance, Propellern, and the Anna Lindh Library) between 09:00 and 17:00 on weekdays. Bringing visitors into the restricted areas constitutes a violation of the Protection Act and is punishable by fines or up to two years in prison.

6. Find housing

The housing situation in Stockholm is challenging, but we in the Student Union want to share a few tips for finding your future home. As a member of the Student Union, you can apply for housing through SSSB, which is owned by the student unions of Stockholm. SSSB offers both corridor housing and apartments in the city center and nearby suburbs.

Blocket-bostad and kvalster.se have thousands of listings in various price ranges.

There are several housing providers in Stockholm that offer apartments.

Bostadsförmedlingen provides both student housing and regular rental contracts from around Stockholm County. Be sure to join their housing queue as soon as possible!

Ask around during the welcome week. Some students might have space for a lodger or be interested in sharing an apartment.

Stockholm is a large city with excellent public transport options. Do not feel limited to living in the city center. SEDU is located right next to Roslagsbanan, which connects large parts of northeastern Stockholm. The subway reaches most suburbs and the commuter train covers the entire county. A commute of 45 to 60 minutes is not unusual.

7. Sign up for the kickoff!

The Student Union's welcome week is a highlight of many students' lives at SEDU. You can find more information about this year's kickoff at fhskar.se/en.

8. Become a member and get involved in the Student Union!

What is the Student Union?

The SEDU Student Union is both fun and incredibly important for you as a student! Sure, the union organizes fun parties and offers unbeatable camaraderie, but its main task is academic advocacy. The union is represented in all of the university's preparatory and decision-making bodies so that you can have as much influence as possible over your studies.

As a member, you can, among other things, get involved in the Student Union's academic advocacy organization (known as the Civil Section) and represent the opinions of your fellow students. Being engaged as a student representative is not only a valuable credential for your future career, but it also gives you an invaluable opportunity to shape your education.

The union is led by the student union board and the board members who are elected by the members at each annual meeting.

Under the board there are three sections:

- Civil Section
- Doctoral Section
- Section for the Higher Officer Program (HOP)

The union also has two committees:

- Student Social Affairs Committee
- · Labor Market Group Kompass

Student Social Affairs Committee

The Student Social Affairs Committee is the part of the Student Union that works to promote a strong sense of community among the university's students by organizing various social events, for example, the kickoff!!

Labor Market Group - Kompass

The Student Union's career activities are mainly carried out through the Labor Market Group - Kompass (AMG). Through AMG, the union creates formal and informal contacts with the labor market on behalf of its members.

Civil section

The Civil Section consists of members from the civilian programs and carries out operational academic advocacy at the university, for example by having its members serve as student representatives in subject and program councils.

Doctoral section

The Doctoral Section is responsible for academic advocacy for the doctoral programs and for fostering social community among SEDU's doctoral students.

Section for the Higher Officer Program

The HOP Section gathers participants in the Higher Officer Program (HOP) at SEDU and works to ensure student influence within the HOP program.

What is the Union Help on the Union Board?

The entire work of the Student Union is led by the student union board. The board is appointed by the members at the annual meeting and works to coordinate the activities of the sections and committees.



Help! Where do I go!?

Don't worry! We know it can be stressful to find your way when you're new. Here's some guidance!

You'll probably have several lectures in the main building of the Swedish Defence University (SEDU) at Drottning Kristinas väg 37. Search for "Lecture Halls" on fhs.se for more information.

Some lectures might also take place in the "L-building", located roughly opposite the main building, next to the so-called Triangle Park. The address is Drottning Kristinas väg 30.

The student union has access to two union houses with microwaves and dining areas. The old union house at Drottning Kristinas väg 37 (opposite the L-building) and the new union house at Drottning Kristinas väg 33 (behind the main building)

Note: The room in the new union house is on the upper floor. Go straight ahead, then take the stairs up through the door on the left


